The purpose of each student's IEP is to help the student prepare for life after school, including an expectation to participate in meaningful employment and/or post-secondary educational opportunities, attain integrated competitive employment, and achieve and as much independence in his/her living arrangements as possible.

To reach these outcomes, student's IEPs should be based on **Age-Appropriate Transition Assessments (AATAs)** which address the students **Preferences, Interests, Needs** and **Strengths**. This will provide the IEP team with the data necessary to make informed decisions concerning the creation of post-secondary goals that will lead to successful and meaningful school and post-school experiences.

In order to help make a variety of AATAs easily available for usage, the Transition Consultants of all sixteen State Support Teams throughout Ohio have worked together to develop an online **Age-Appropriate Transition Library**. This website, updated quarterly, hosts numerous free assessments which teachers, support personnel, staff, students and parents may access and use in order to help best evaluate, discuss, and plan for the needs of students during the IEP process.
